Dear brothers and sisters, Dear children,

Today, we are called to reflect on the prayer of our Savior Jesus Christ, which offers us a true lesson about what it means to be a community of faith and the role our unity plays in the world's testimony.

In this holy prayer, Jesus does not pray only for His disciples of that time, but also for all who will believe through their word. This is a universal calling that includes each one of us today. It is we who, through our faith, must continue His work and be His living testimony in the world.

Jesus asks for something essential: unity. "That they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us." This is a unity that springs from the close relationship of Jesus with the Father, a profound unity of love and communion.

This unity is not merely an external form but a deep life in Christ, a union of hearts in faith, love, and service. When we, who follow Christ, are united, our light shines brightly in the darkness of the world. And this light of our unity becomes a living sign for others: "that the world may believe that You have sent Me."

Therefore, our unity is a sacred mission. It is one of the most powerful testimonies we can offer the world - not so much through words, but through our shared life, through the way we love and support one another.

Moreover, Jesus assures us that this unity is a participation in His communion with the Father: "that they also may be one in Us." It is an invitation to divine life, to live in communion with God. Thus, unity is not something imposed, but a fruit of God's love that binds us together.

Dear brothers and sisters, let us preserve this unity, cultivate it with humility and love, forgive, and seek reconciliation, so that through our lives united in Christ, the world may see and believe in the saving power of God.

Let us pray that the Lord helps us to be one, to be one in Him and through Him, for the glory of the Father and the salvation of those around us.

Dear children.

What a beautiful day is this! You are dressed in your finest clothes, your families are smiling, and the church is filled with joy. Do you know why?

Because today, something amazing is happening - something that even the angels in Heaven are celebrating. Today, you receive Jesus for the very first time in Holy Communion! You've been preparing for this moment. You've learned about Jesus, about the Mass, about the bread and wine that become the Body and Blood of Christ. You've made your First Confession. You've practiced praying. And now, your hearts are ready. And today, Jesus comes to you not just to visit, but to stay in your heart. He wants to live in you, to walk with you, and to be your best friend forever.

After today, Jesus hopes you'll keep Him close. But how?

- Talk to Him Pray every day. Even simple words like, "Thank You, Jesus," or "Help me, Jesus," are perfect.
- Come to Mass Each Sunday, Jesus waits to see you again in the Eucharist.
- Be kind Every time you love others, forgive, and share, you are loving Jesus too.
- Remember this moment Keep today in your heart. You've received the most important gift in the world.

Dear children, today is the day Jesus comes into your heart in a special way. When you kneel at the altar and receive Holy Communion, whisper quietly to Him: "Jesus, I love You. Stay with me forever."

And He will. He will walk with you in school, at home, with your friends, when you're happy or sad. He will be with you your whole life.

So, smile, be joyful, and celebrate - because today, Heaven touched your heart.
